Community service engages students in communities through activities that primarily focus on a service provided and how that service will make a difference in the lives of the recipients.

What is Service Learning?

Service-Learning is a teaching methodology in which community service opportunities serve as the connection between theory and practice for students, while at the same time instructors using this methodology to ensure that a real and needed service is provided to the community. Service learning uses experiential pedagogy to reinforce course content and improve class retention.
