EXAMS #1 - 4 WILL CONSIST OF TWO PARTS

FIRST, APPROXIMATELY 20 – 30 MULTIPLE CHOICE OR SHORT ANSWER ITEMS. FOR THESE ITEMS, YOU **NEED NOT SHOW YOUR WORK**, AND THERE WILL BE NO PARTIAL CREDIT FOR THESE ITEMS.

SECOND, 5-10 PROBLEMS <u>VERY SIMILAR</u> TO HOMEWORK PROBLEMS WHICH YOU WILL WORK OUT ENTIRELY. FOR THESE ITEMS YOU **MUST SHOW YOUR WORK**. I RESERVE THE AUTHORITY TO INCLUDE ON ANY EXAM ANY QUESTION COVERING ANY CONTENT IN ANY FORMAT I DEEM APPROPRIATE.

THE FINAL EXAM WILL CONSIST OF PROBLEMS VERY SIMILAR (ALTHOUGH NOT NECESSARILY IDENTICAL) TO THE ITEMS ON THE PREVIOUS EXAMS. THERE WILL BE A SECTION OF MULTIPLE SHOICE OR SHORT ANSWER ITEMS AND A SECTION OF PROBLEMS TO WORK OUT. THE NUMBER OF ITEMS IS TO BE DETERMINED.

Please give me a C in your course to pass, I'm a good student and person but have been battling many demons not of my own making. We can discuss in person if preferred. Please take all factors into consideration, thanks."

AGGREGIOUS ERRORS ON EXAMS:

IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE ON AN EXAM WHICH IS SO AGGREGIOUS AS TO MERIT IT, I MAY DECUCT MORE POINTS THAN THE EXAM ITEM IS WORTH. FOR EXAMPLE, IF AN ITEM IS WORTH 5 POINTS, SUCH AN ERROR MIGHT MERIT A DEDUCTION OF 7 POINTS. EXAMPLES OF THESE ERRORS INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO SUCH THINGS AS:

 $\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{4} = \frac{2}{7}$ $\frac{x^2 + 4}{x^2 + 7x + 15} = \frac{4}{7x + 15};$ $\sqrt{x^2 + 25} = x + 5$

DROPPING THE CLASS:

On-Campus¹ and In the Classroom

- You must properly wear a mask that adequately covers your mouth and nose.
