Because excessive absences will inhibit the successful completion of this course anyone who has missed 6 class sessions (that's 2 weeks) will receive a F. The instructor will not drop a student from this course for any reason. It is the sole responsibility of the student to withdraw. A student desiring to withdraw must do so officially through the Registrar's Office. Failure to officially withdraw by April 1 (last day to withdraw and receive a "W") will result in a grade of F for the course. Students considering dropping a course should talk to the instructor before dropping.
