Evaluation

Grades will be determined by the completion of all Assignments, Discussions, Quizzes, Mid-Term and Final Exams on C4E; Attendance Check-In on D2L.

- ★ A suggested schedule will be posted in D2L.
- ★ There are 48 lessons and quizzes, plus 2 Writing assignments and the Mid-Term and Final Exam.

Mid-Term and Final Exams:

Logging into our class and completing assignments is the way to be successful in our class. Each week you must "Check in" on the Qwickly App (located under "Course Activities." I open and close the "Check-In" each week on Sunday. On the following Tuesday, I will review your "Check In" and will modify your "Attendance Grade" which reflects the following activity:

Your "Attendance" grade will be calculated in the following way:

- Present (100%); If you have logged into Qwickly on D2L and have completed some assignments on C4E. If have already completed C4E assignments, you still need to log in to Qwickly on D2L during that week.
- Late (80%) If you have not logged into Qwickly on D2L but have completed some of the C4E assignments.
- Absent (0%) If you haven't logged into Qwickly on D2L or completed any of the assignments on C4E
 - Attendance is IMPORTANT in an Online class. Logging in and completing assignments is essential.
 - A student who anticipates the inability to complete assignments should notify the instructor in advance.
 - Incomplete assignments, quizzes, exams, spotty logins, and noncommunication will inhibit the successful completion of this course.
 - If you have not completed the required Writing Assignments, Quizzes, and by the Projected Due Dates you will receive an F.
 - The instructor will not drop a student from this course for any reason. It is the sole responsibility of the student to withdraw. A student desiring to withdraw must do so officially through the Registrar's Office. Failure to officially withdraw by the last day to withdraw and receive a "W" will result in a grade of F for the course. Students considering dropping a course should talk to the instructor before dropping.
 - If you have not completed ASSIGNMENTS, QUIZZES, EXAMS or communicated with me regarding your lack of interactions by the Mid-Term (June 17), you must drop this class or you will receive an F.
