"American was founded as a Christian nation!"

"America was <u>not</u> founded as a Christian nation!"

How does one decide which claim to accept - believe / continue accepting - believing?

- 1. On the <u>sincerity</u> of the one making the claim alone?? No!
- 2. On the <u>confidence</u>-in-assertion of the one making the claim alone?? No!
- 3. Because it "feels good' to accept / believe the claim?? No!
- 4. Because it benefits you to believe / accept the claims?? No!
- 5. Because there is evidence / argument that the claim is true? YES!

But, a logically prior question is:

How does one understand the question / claims - and any assertion or denial of the claim?

- 1. What was the 'FOUNDING'?
- 2. What is a Christian 'NATION'?
- 3. What is a 'CHRISTIAN' nation?
- = Philosophy concerns itself with <u>conceptual / language analysis of statements / claims</u>
 and (then) <u>arguments</u> in support of, or against claims / beliefs.

[An 'argument' is "...a verbal attempt to persuade someone as to the truth of a claim by providing reasons / evidence WHY they should accept the claim (as true)."
- Robert C. Solomon]
